SOARING EAGLE ARTS, BEATS & EATS PRESENTED BY FLAGSTAR BANK TO BRING THE PARTY TO ROYAL OAK FOR THE 26th ANNUAL EVENT

- Labor Day weekend's most anticipated event brings top national and local musical acts to downtown Royal Oak, Michigan
- Attendees can enjoy craveable culinary options from more than 50 restaurants and food trucks

ROYAL OAK, Mich. – **Soaring Eagle Arts, Beats & Eats presented by Flagstar Bank**, Oakland County's premier festival now in its 26th year, returns this Labor Day weekend, Sept. 1-4, in downtown Royal Oak to deliver even more exciting family-friendly entertainment. This year's festival is going all out, featuring more than 200 stellar musical acts, the highly regarded Juried Fine Art Show, some of the best food offerings from across metro Detroit and plenty of family-friendly fun.

"Arts, Beats & Eats is the big blowout event that for many marks the end of the summer, so we always strive to expand and introduce innovative offerings to keep the hundreds of thousands of people coming back to make the most of this time of year," said Jon Witz, producer of Arts, Beats & Eats. "We invite everyone to come out to take in the sounds of various genres of music, feast on mouthwatering cuisine and explore new taste offerings, browse and shop one-of-a-kind artworks, and make lifetime memories with the family and more."

THE BEATS

The national and local star power at this year's festival will feature more than 200 of the area's top bands and musical acts performing on nine stages.

On the Jim Beam National Stage, headlining acts include **Bell Biv DeVoe** ("Poison" and "Do Me!"); **Halestorm** ("I Miss the Misery" and "Love Bites"); **Joan Jett & The Blackhearts** ("I Love Rock 'n' Roll" and "Cherry Bomb"); **Russell Dickerson** ("Every Little Thing" and "Blue Tacoma"); **Randy Houser** ("How Country Feels" and "Runnin' Outta Moonlight"); and **Collective Soul** ("Shine" and "The World I Know"). Also performing on the National Stage is pop-rock band **American Authors** ("Best Day of My Life" and "Deep Water"). Dozens of talented musicians from across metro Detroit will be showcased on eight additional music stages offering a variety of genres.

House of Dank, Michigan's premiere cannabis company, returns as sponsor of the **House of Dank Performance Stage** to deliver top house, electro funk and disco DJs including **DJ Seoul**, **Walter Glasshouse** and **Joshua Adams**; performances by hip hop, pop and R&B artists including **Brayden**, **Julian LaHood**, **Nick Ryan** and **Sarah Marcus**; breakdancing from the **Motor City**

Street Dance Academy and various entertaining acts from the **Motley Misfits** buskers, as well as **The Royal Runway! fashion show** produced by Channel Iris, a creative studio based in Detroit. The fashion show will feature the hottest trends from numerous downtown Royal Oak businesses, including Noir Leather, Bloboho, Jilly Rocks, Blue Jean Blues, Seven Eleven and Profit.

On Saturday, Sept. 2, Zumba fans can get ready to dance and sweat during the annual **Priority Health Zumbathon**, a fun, dynamic and high energy event that will benefit the **Special Olympics**. This long-running, favorite festival activity will transform the Jim Beam National Stage that morning from 10 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. into a sizzling and exhilarating dance fitness explosion. In collaboration with Vibe Fit Studio, a prominent metro Detroit fitness studio, the event will feature more than 150 other local Zumba instructors from across Michigan, as well as students from **Vibe Fit's Fitness 4 All** class for teens and adults with special needs. THE ARTS

More than 120 artists from across the nation will converge in downtown Royal Oak to showcase and sell their original works of art, including a variety of newcomers alongside returning favorites, in this year's **Corewell Health Juried Fine Art Show**. A vast selection of styles and mediums will be represented by these artists, who are eligible to win cash awards totaling more than \$7,000, including the top three "Best in Show" and "Awards of Excellence" in each of the respective categories mentioned.

New this year is **live glassblowing demonstrations** from Glass Academy. STATE 'GREEN LIGHTS' CANNABIS SALES AND CONSUMPTION

House of Dank will bring a new and improved immersive 'DankLand' pop-up experience that features Instagrammable opportunities, yard games, the loyalty money machine, a car giveaway and custom limited-edition House of Dank apparel and accessories to light up the night when the evening entertainment begins. With the State of Michigan approved license, House of Dank will be the first-ever activation at a major Michigan festival that features the sale and consumption of cannabis. Both spaces will be open to all Arts, Beats & Eats attendees 21 years and older in a designated and creative space, and will not take place near family activities, high-end artwork and food vendors.

ARTS, BEATS & EATS ON FIFTH

On Thursday, Aug. 24, a special charity preview party celebrating the 26th annual return of Arts Beats & Eats will take place from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m., with special highlights of the festival's artists, entertainment by the award-winning Alise King and the always electrifying Cast Iron Cornbread band, and sweet and savory samples from featured restaurants, including delicious and refreshing acai bowls from Nautical Bowls, delectable elote courtesy of Drunken Rooster, creamy mac and cheese by Café Muse and more. Event sponsorships and individual tickets are available for purchase. Tickets are \$100 for VIP early access to the event and \$50 for general admission. COLLABORATIONS AND CELEBRATIONS OF CULTURE, DESIGN + DIVERSITY Red Handprint

In solidarity with our friends and partners at the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe of Michigan and indigenous people across North America, Soaring Eagle Arts Beats & Eats will prominently feature the Red Handprint on signs in the Art Fair and on educational messages integrated throughout the festival. Native American artist, Inty Muenala, will paint a mural of the Red Handprint on a special canvas located on Fifth Street. **Red Handprint** aims to prevent acts of violence against vulnerable members in the Native American community. According to the Urban Indian Health Institute, murder is the third leading cause of death for native women.

Flagstar Bank presents Culture on 4th

Culture on 4th is a space dedicated to celebrating diverse backgrounds and cultures. In addition to being home to the Flagstar Bank International Stage, a platform for performers and musicians delivering dance and music from across the world, Flagstar is offering booth space for a collection of artists, small businesses and food vendors throughout the Culture on 4th area, including: <u>Blu Jean Blues</u>, a Royal Oak-based minority women owned business that offers custom contemporary women's clothing; <u>Natural Viking</u>, a veteran owned and operated, family-run business that sells handmade, natural and organic men's care products such as beard balms; Krazy Karnivore, a veteran owned and operated blacksmithing business offering live blacksmithing demos and classes; and <u>Pingree Detroit</u>, another veteran owned and locally operated business that creates sustainable products from upcycled automotive materials, and teaches and employs veterans overcoming homelessness in shoe making, leather crafting and industrial sewing.

Culture on 4th will also be home to <u>Aratham Gourmet To Go</u>, offering 100 percent vegan menu items in biodegradable serving containers; <u>Fork in Nigeria</u>, a colorful food truck and soon-to-be brick and mortar in Midtown Detroit selling its popular North African cuisine; and <u>Love Froyo</u>,

owned and operated by an immigrant from Pakistan who will sell soft serve ice cream and a traditional Pakistani dessert.

Baker College Culinary Students Shine

Renowned for its top-notch culinary arts program, Baker College teamed up with Give Thanks Bakery, ImaginATE and a nonprofit organization to give three exceptionally talented culinary students from the college the opportunity to create exclusive menu items that will be featured at the festival. Notably, a portion of the proceeds generated from the sale of these unique items will be generously donated to Open Hands Pantry, a community-based nonprofit food pantry that serves those in need. The three recipes designed by participating students include a **Honey Chipotle Glazed Chicken by Steven Stempnik** working alongside ImaginATE restaurant, **Chewy Lemon Brownies by Maya Van Buskirk** in collaboration with Give Thanks Bakery, and a **Smoke Cherry Bourbon Blast cocktail developed by Mikal Jones** that will be available at the Bar on 6th Street next to the Baker College Country Americana Stage.

Pensole Lewis College of Business & Design Students Create Mural

Through a partnership with Kroger, Micah Shumake a student from Pensole Lewis College of Business & Design, the nation's first Historically Black College/University focused on design, has developed and designed a mural that will be created and showcased at this year's festival. Shumake's mural theme will be uniting people through shared community experiences, culture and events, much like how Arts, Beats & Eats has brought people together in its 26-year existence.

FAMILY FUN ALL WEEKEND LONG

Fun, family-friendly programming and entertainment will be bustling throughout the four-day festival in **The Detroit News Kids Zone**, located on the north end of the festival near 4th and Main streets. The Kids Zone features FREE activities for families, courtesy of The Detroit News, including science experiments from the Michigan Science Center. Kids will also have the opportunity to make a playful paper pocket fan, magnificent musical maracas, and create their very own rendition of this year's Arts, Beats and Eats commemorative poster at the United Way Crafts Area located within the Detroit News Kids Zone.

Kids can also enjoy a full lineup of award-winning artists and performers, as well as exciting interactive entertainment on the **Detroit Institute of Arts Kids Stage.** Scheduled acts include **Magic with Randyl Lee, Zippity: 2 Guys & a Guitar, Nat Spinz Hula Hoops and Kids Tunes with Kevin Devine.** The lineup also features Ballet Folklorico de Detroit, Revolution Chinese Yoyo and Tap Dance Detroit.

Later each evening of the festival, **DJs** will hit the stage to spin tunes and drop beats. The lineup includes including **Dru Ruiz**, a Detroit native who specializes in techno, hip-hop and house; **DJ DAV**, a Michigan State University alum and seasoned veteran of the DJ scene; and **DJ Katalist**, who is Detroit-raised and always a favorite.

10th ANNUAL FAMILY DAYS

Soaring Eagle Arts, Beats & Eats has partnered with **Corewell Heath** to host the **10**th **annual Family Days**, in collaboration with **the Judson Center and the Ted Lindsey Foundation Hope Center**. On Saturday, Sept. 2 and Sunday, Sept. 3, hundreds of children on the autism spectrum and their family members will receive a one-day access pass to enjoy festival offerings at no cost. The access pass includes free parking, lunch and carnival rides. The festival will open one hour earlier so participating families and their children can enjoy the offerings in a calmer environment.
